OVERVIEW

Spiritual gifts aren't just for spiritual moments—they're for everyday life. In this lesson, students will discover how their gifts work in practical settings, how to stay under spiritual authority, and how to use their gifts with confidence and humility.

Scripture Passage

1 Peter 4:10–11 (KJV)

As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God; if any man minister, let him do it as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

EDUCATE

Point 1: Gifts are meant to move.

God didn't give you a gift so you could hide it—He gave it to you so you could use it. Whether you're praying with a friend, sharing a verse, or encouraging someone in youth, your gift shines when you take action.

Where do you think God wants to use you right now—in school, youth, home, or somewhere else?

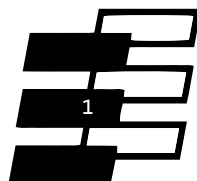
Point 2: Stay submitted to authority.
